When David is forced to attend a social group for people with autism, he feels out of place. He's slick and enjoys telling dirty jokes, but is bored by the others, and begs his parents (Jessica Walter and Tibor Feldman) to stop going. However, as he spends more time there with Sarah, he begins to fall for her sweet, outgoing spirit.

The film is a reminder that the relationships of people with autism aren't that different from the ones we've been swooning over for decades.
